DECEPTION IS THE CHINESE COMMUNIST WAY OF WAR (AND LIFE ITSELF)

Below, are excerpts from an article written by Commander Mark Metcalf, US Navy (Retired).

The Article appeared in the U.S. Navy Institute, February 2017.

NOTE: I have taken just a few of the main points of the article, in the interest of time and clarity, to quickly explain the value of Sun-Tzu's most famous – and often overlooked – quote:

“All warfare is based on deception.”

“Chinese military interpretations of Sun-Tzu are key to understanding their rationale for strategy and operations.”

Chinese military texts on the teachings attributed to Sun-Tzu emphasize the radical and effective nature of deception in Chinese warfare.

In concise summation, here are the 12 Methods of Deception of Sun-Tzu:

1. When one is capable, give the appearance of being incapable.
2. When one is active, give the appearance of being inactive.
3. When one is near, give the appearance of being far.
4. When one is far, give the appearance of being near.

5. When one's opponents are greedy for advantage, tempt them.
6. When one's opponents are in chaos, seize them.
7. When one's opponents are secure, prepare for them.
8. When one's opponents are strong, evade them.
9. When one's opponents are angry, aggravate them.
10. When one's opponents are humble, make them arrogant.
11. When one's opponents are at ease, make them weary.
12. When one's opponents are friendly to each other, divide them.

- The purpose of the first four methods (“capable” though “far”) is to deceive or mislead an adversary.
- The next four methods (“greedy” though “strong”) provide ways of adopting a flexible response strategy for different enemy situations.
- The last four methods (“angry” though “friendly”) discuss weakening an adversary's war-fighting capability by focusing on morale, psychology, stamina,

cohesiveness, etc., thus causing the enemy's strong points to become weaknesses.

When these methods were appropriately employed, Sun-Tzu then implored his followers to:

“Attack them when they are unprepared: Come forth when they are not expecting you to do so.”

THE BASIS OF GUERRILLA WARFARE

As you can see from the excerpts above, this is the essence of Guerilla Warfare, the same methods used in the Vietnam War, by the Viet Cong and the North Vietnamese Regular Army.

America simply did not understand, nor even try to comprehend, these military concepts *on a massive scale*.

The United States *Special Forces* were the first organized unit to take these teachings to heart, and employ them in Vietnam. However, the US Military was still entrenched in the mindset of *conventional warfare*.

As a positive legacy of the Vietnam War, the concept of *The Art of War* has now been fully embraced, both theoretically (in the classroom) – and much more important – on the battlefield itself.
